
Tic-Tac-Toe Assembly Instructions

1. Design and decorate your game pieces.

a. You can draw pictures on your pieces, practice handwriting your initials, or even use stickers and stamps, if you have some at home.



b. It can be helpful to use the same design on all the blue pieces and a separate design on all the orange pieces, but you don't have to. The colour of the outlining circle will be what you use to identify which pieces belong to which player.

2. Cut out your game pieces.

a. You can cut them out in circles or in squares, whichever you prefer, just be sure to leave the outlining blue and orange circles intact.

3. Find someone you'd like to play with and challenge them to a game.

How To Play Tic-Tac-Toe

1. Decide who's going to go first.

- a. It could be the player who is the youngest, the player who is the oldest, the player who has the longest hair, or the player whose favourite colour is yellow. If you play more than one game, try taking turns going first.
- 2. Player One chooses a square on the grid and places one of their game pieces on it.
- 3. Player Two chooses a square on the grid and places one of their game pieces on it.
- 4. Keep switching turns, placing your pieces on empty squares on the grid. The first player to make a line with their pieces -- it can be a straight line or a diagonal one -- wins!
- 5. If you come to a point where neither player can make a line, clear your pieces off the board and start a new game.
